The confusion and the controversy: the result of being misguided and mistaken!

- (1) The Source: an innocent misunderstanding (Acts 2:38)
 - The prior context of the Day of Pentecost (John 21:15-22; Matthew 26:69-75;28:18-20)
 - >> Peter's great message preceded by a significant awareness
 - >> Pentecost's great results: the fulfillment of an awesome promise
 - The ensuing context of the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:42-47)
 - >> the need for teaching the 3,000 new disciples
 - >> the need for clarification of any possible confusion
- (2) The Solution: a necessary correction (Acts 3:17-26)
 - The ripple effect of a revised methodology
 - >> understood by Phillip (Acts 8:38-37)
 - >> followed up by Peter (Acts 10:43)
 - The apostle Paul: the man of that moment
 - >> fully implemented by Paul (Acts 13:38; 16:30-31)
 - >> the indisputable distinction of Paul (1 Corinthians 1:17)
- (3) The Sequel: a commission requiring transition (Acts 1:8)
 - Peter: the tumultuous man in transition
 - >> the highlights (Acts 10:9-11:18; Acts 15:6-11)
 - >> the lowlight (Galatians 2:11-14)
 - Baptism: not required but not optional
 - >> to believe it is required is a serious doctrinal error (Galatians 1:6-9, 5:1-12, 6:12-15)
 - >> to believe it is optional is an act of disobedience (1 Peter 3:21-22)
